

## PIET's 10<sup>th</sup> Summer Peacebuilding Institute

SPI 2008 opened May 23<sup>rd</sup>, with a late Taizé candlelight prayer service. Twenty-two weary international guests arrived at Church of the Savior in Knoxville, Tennessee, after a full day of classes and a seven-hour drive. Perhaps it was the luck of the draw, perhaps it was the corporate interfaith prayer, or perhaps both, but the service was the prelude to one of the best SPI gatherings in the 10-year history of the event. It seems that every year the participants are more mature and engaged than the year before. This year our guests represented South Korea, India, Indonesia, Vietnam, Myanmar, Nepal, and the Philippines in Asia; Lebanon and Palestine in the Middle East; Nigeria, Rwanda, Uganda, and Egypt in Africa; Colombia and Argentina in South America; and Boulder, Colorado in North America. Our own community representation included Baha'is, Buddhists, Hindus, Muslims, and Christians. This rich mix of cultures and religions was deeply moving. The common bond we all shared, our commitment to peace, found expression in myriad ways through the ministries and projects of all the participants.

The most meaningful experience for many of SPI's participants is probably staying with local families. This provides opportunities for guests and hosts to experience a different culture and share hopes and dreams. But the other parts of the Institute also offer chances to experience intercultural and interfaith community: sharing peace concerns in the Saturday night discussion of Peace Issues; visiting nine local churches and Baha'i meeting on Sunday morning; joining in games on Sunday

afternoon; and breaking bread together for three days.

Eighteen of the twenty-two international guests expressed interest in affiliating with Peacebuilding Institute of East Tennessee (PIET) for the purpose of replicating the organization in manners appropriate to their own countries. PIET is currently following up on these requests and will include them on our website, [www.peacebuildinginstitute.org](http://www.peacebuildinginstitute.org), as affiliates develop their own organizations to meet the peace needs of their own cultures. We pray that this will contribute to spreading a culture of peace to every country in our violence-weary world. We have faith that it is, indeed, happening already.

*In May we received a communication from Doug Hunt, Chair of the Justice Team of Church of the Savior, United Church of Christ, Knoxville, TN, requesting information about the PIET program. Following is our reply:*

Dear Doug,

I first want to thank you and the Justice Team for your response to John Lackey's presentation and for recommending Peacebuilding Institute of East Tennessee for a current donation from the team's funds and a slot on the schedule of 2<sup>nd</sup> mile gifts. We do get a lot done for a relatively few dollars, but our financial limitations have imposed some difficulties for us from time to time. The COS provision will make a difference in what we are able to accomplish. Thank you.

You had relayed a request through John for a list of PIET events. This will vary a bit from year to year, but in 2008 the events will have included:

February 1 & 2 -- *PIET Winter Workshop, Teaching Nonviolence* -- This is an annual workshop targeting teachers in public and private schools in the area. Continuing education credit is available to teachers through this workshop.

February 23 -- PIET made the logistical arrangements for the Counter Recruitment Counselor Training all-day session with Bill Galvin of the Center for Conscience and War.

March 11 & 13 -- *God's Healing Strategy* -- a 2-part, 6-hour workshop led by Michael and Lorri Hardin of Preaching Peace. (<http://www.preachingpeace.org/>)

March 14-15 -- *Nonviolent Atonement* -- an intensive day-long workshop presented by Michael Hardin of Preaching Peace;

Tony Barlett, theologian from Bexley Hall Seminary (Episcopal) in New York State; and Sharon Baker, theologian from Messiah College (Church of the Brethren) in Pennsylvania.

May 23-26 -- *Summer Peacebuilding Institute*. This is an annual event where we bring in peacebuilders from around the world for an intensive 3 days of person-to-person interaction and networking with peacebuilders here. This year we had 22 international guests, 3 of whom participated in the Issues class and worship here at COS on the 25<sup>th</sup>. From the 22 we have 18 who signed agreements to replicate the work of PIET in their countries. Of particular note are those from Columbia, Lebanon, Myanmar, and Vietnam. We provide organizational guidance and a place on our website, [www.peacebuildinginstitute.org](http://www.peacebuildinginstitute.org) and, in some instances, limited financial help. These will be in addition to the affiliates we already have in about 75 other countries. We also are just beginning to replicate our Knoxville organization in Atlanta, Georgia and Boulder, Colorado.

October 25 & November 1 -- *Fall Peacemakers' Conference* -- This is an annual event the purpose of which is to provide training for local peacemakers in some aspect of peace-building. This year's theme is Exploring Nonviolent Living.

Another area of interest is *Nonviolent Communication*. We currently have a practice group of about 10 persons committed to learning this discipline. Three members of the PIET organization will be going for facilitator training and certification later this year and next year. Our plan is to begin offering workshops in nonviolent communication to churches,

schools and other groups early next year. We anticipate that this will likely become a major focus of the organization.

We also have three persons in PIET who are making plans to provide youth leadership training and youth program materials in peacemaking to churches and camps throughout the region. Our Atlanta affiliate is already working in this area as is our affiliate in Nigeria. We will be incorporating some of their resources in our own programs, resources which we helped them to develop over the past year.

PIET is an interfaith organization that includes Christians (Protestants & Catholics), Muslims, Baha'i's, Hindus, and Buddhists both here and among our affiliates. We are an inclusive organization in every sense of the word. In the Knoxville area, 10 churches (and other religious groups) regularly participate in PIET's programs, a number which we are attempting to significantly increase. All of our participants are volunteers, some of whom are virtually full-time. Seven COS members are in leadership positions with PIET.

We publish bi-monthly an online newsletter, [ICS Peace Memo](#), which generally runs to more than a dozen pages of information on current and future events, interesting facts and commentary relevant to peace, and reports on recent events both here and in other areas in which we have affiliates. It is currently being sent online to almost 800 persons locally who have either participated or are currently participating in one or more of our programs.

I think this pretty well sums up the current state of the organization. I will be pleased to answer any additional questions you may have either at our Justice Team meet-

ings or by email or phone. May God bless us all with his/her peace!

*Note to readers of ICS Peace Memo: As PIET has had opportunities to respond to new possibilities for promoting peace both locally and around the world, it has been our practice to respond first and then try to figure out how we will pay for it. This is becoming an increasingly difficult practice to sustain as these opportunities proliferate. The 2008 Summer Peacebuilding Institute alone cost us over \$1,300 more than we had in the bank. But, as a volunteer organization, we do not have time, energy, or expertise to engage in serious fundraising, thus making support such as that offered by Church of the Savior both a welcome and an essential initiative. We are loathe to cut back our peacebuilding initiatives but may find it necessary to do so in the future, unless other churches and individuals come forward with additional financial resources. **I BELIEVE** in the stewardship of life and resources to the end that all may mutually benefit from the earth's bounty and that no person may have to go without food or shelter.


**I BELIEVE** in the primacy of human relationships as a person committed and responsible to other persons, regardless of their economic status, race, creed or nationality.

## Interesting Facts

Memorial Day is actually NOT a day to pray for US troops who died in action, but rather a day set aside by Congress to pray for peace. The 1950 Joint Resolution of Congress which created Memorial Day says: "Requesting the President to issue a proclamation designating May 30, Memorial Day, as a day for a Nation-wide prayer for peace." (*64 Statute 158*)

In World War I, 116,000 U.S. soldiers were killed, AND 8,000,000 soldiers from other countries and perhaps another 8,000,000 civilians also died. In World War II, about 408,000 U.S. soldiers were killed, AND worldwide at least another 20,000,000 soldiers and civilians were killed. More than 58,000 Americans died in the Vietnam War. Over 150,000 committed suicide. Civilians? The U.S. has used its armed forces abroad over 230 times, over 60 times since World War II, according to the *Dept. of the Navy Historical Center*.

The U.S. has finally admitted that some of the weapons brought into Iraq were not from Iran. They were actually from the U.S., which is the biggest supplier of weapons in the world.

Up to 700 people were arrested in the recent immigration raid in Postville Iowa; 270 of them were sentenced to 5 months in jail. Up to 83 immigrants have died while in US custody. – [Democracy Now](#), 5/13/08

The U.S. government has injected hundreds of immigrants with dangerous psychotropic drugs against their will to keep them sedated during their trip being deported back to their home countries. – [Washington Post](#), 5/14/08

In 1948, some 700,000 Palestinians were expelled from their homes, and their land was given over to the Israelis. There has been no peace since then between the Palestinians and Israel.

Some 2,500 total youths are in jail in Iraq, Afghanistan and Guantánamo Bay–

The U.S. is illegally holding more Iraqis in prison than ever before – 24,700 – and is expanding its facilities to accommodate another 10,000. The Iraqi government is holding 25,000 Iraqis in jail, bringing the total number of prisoners to almost 51,000. – [Global Policy Forum](#)

About 91,600 Iraqis were paid with U.S. tax money in exchange for not fighting. – [Harper's Index](#), May 2008

After World War II, the Japanese were spared having to serve in any wars. The Japanese Constitution (written by Americans) says war is not the Japanese national doctrine for resolving international disputes or for ensuring their national security. They have had 60 years of peace. To those who say the reason the Japanese have not had to go to war is that the U.S. has taken the role of defending Japan, the Japanese replied, "Attack from whom? From those the U.S. threatens? Let us live in peace, and our example will hopefully make the entire world more peaceful." – Ann Wright, co-author of *Dissent: Voices of Conscience*

There are 630 U.S. corporations on the payroll of the Pentagon. It has been shown that \$1.8 billion in Iraqi assets were mishandled. The U.S. occupation authorities early in the conflict with Iraq could not account for the disbursement of \$8.8 billion in Iraqi oil money and seized assets. Some 70% of our intelligence budget

money goes to private contractors. –

The U.S. military gave a total of \$134.8 million in payments to its allies in the Iraq invasion. From April 2001 to June 2006 the Army made 183,486 commercial and other payments from field offices in Kuwait and Egypt, for a total of \$10.7 billion of tax money. In one instance, a U.S. Treasury check for \$5,674,075 was written to pay a company called Al Kasid Specialized Vehicles Trading Co. in Baghdad for items that a voucher does not even describe. – [New York Times](#), 5/23/08

Cuba wants answers from the Bush administration on allegations that a top U.S. diplomat in Havana ferried money from an anti-Castro exile group in Miami to opposition figures in Cuba. The cash is said to have come from Santiago Alvarez, who was once convicted in the U.S. for conspiring to collect military-style weapons to overthrow Cuba's government. –

The Bush administration wants to have permanent U.S. military bases in Iraq and is planning to upgrade a 37 square mile U.S. military base just 35 miles from the Iranian border. - [FCNL](#), 5/13/08

*Israel's Army Radio* reported that President Bush intends to launch a military strike against Iran before the end of his term.

Nearly 10,000 Palestinians, including women and children, have been abducted and languish in Israeli prisons, many without charge or trial. Some 30 Palestinian parliamentarians elected by the people are also imprisoned by Israelis. – [Newsmax](#), 5/20/08

The U.S. rightfully criticizes the Myanmar government for not allowing NGOs into the country to help the victims of the cyclone. However, the U.S. did not allow Cuban doctors or financial aid from Venezuela into this country to help the Katrina victims. Some of the aid supplied by European countries for the victims was never distributed and rotted in warehouses. Let's take the board out of our eyes. – *Don Timmerman*

Researchers estimate that foreign mining companies in Tanzania have earned about \$2.5 billion from exports, but Tanzania only records about \$100 million from gold earnings. Tanzania, one of the most impoverished countries in the world, is losing more than \$400 billion from tax concessions and tax evasion (non-payment of corporate tax and waivers on income tax on expatriate workers). – [NewsNotes](#), May-June 2008

There are 27 million slaves worldwide. The U.S. State Dept. estimates that 17,500 slaves are brought into the U.S. each year. An estimated 50,000 slaves are forced to work as prostitutes, farm workers and domestic servants in the U.S. – Kevin Bales, author of *Ending Slavery: How We Free Today's Slaves* and [Free the Slaves organization](#)

The U.S. military is asking for \$3.69 billion for all fuels, a \$2.2 billion increase over their initial request for fiscal year 2009. The military uses more fuel than any other industry in the US. – *Army Times*

The U.S. refused to join 100 other governments in Dublin, Ireland, to attend talks on banning cluster bombs. Russia, China, Israel, India, and Pakistan also stayed


